1. Introduction: Nexus e-dialogues

As analysed in D7.1 Communication & Dissemination Strategy, the REXUS project places strong emphasis on building Learning and Action Alliances in pilot areas as a means of bridging the gap between Water-Energy-Food-Climate-Ecosystems Nexus scientific research and policymaking. However, while it can be assumed that the scientific community understands and accepts the validity of the Nexus approach, this is not the case with end-users and stakeholders, such as farmers, and often policymakers. For many of the latter, the Nexus may be an unknown concept, or at best a theoretical construct which they cannot relate to their own experience and agenda. REXUS recognizes that many of the stakeholders it will engage will initially not see themselves as stakeholders of an integrated Nexus approach.

It is key to consider that for local stakeholders, Nexus will be the *end state* of affairs, rather than the starting point. The project's communication approach needs to build understanding from the ground up – not seeking to impose its own concepts on reality on the ground, but gradually connecting the evolving reality in the pilot sites developing reality to the Nexus framework.

REXUS stakeholders sitting together for the first time, jointly discussing and analyzing challenges will feel they are enriching their viewpoint by seeing things from a different vantage point. Being able to jointly devise solutions and overcome barriers for their entire basin systems will provide them with the best 'experiential proof' of the value of the Nexus approach.

The Nexus e-dialogues are a communication tool aiming precisely to boost this experiential process. They take the form of video and audio broadcasts which will lay out, in simple and concrete ways and using practical examples, the Nexus challenges of the pilot areas. They will discuss the challenges involved with the building of effective Learning and Action Alliances, also sharing best practices and lessons learned. Nexus e-dialogues will also discuss how the project can offer solutions that are relevant and useful from the local stakeholder's perspectives, rather than from a strictly scientific viewpoint.

The Nexus e-dialogues will engage members of the project's consortium, as well as stakeholders from pilot areas, to give their own accounts in a manner that is sincere and direct, without hiding the challenges and difficulties from view, and also sharing the members' personal visions and aspirations.



2. The Nexus E-dialogues

2.1 REXUS project vision

This Nexus e-dialogue takes the form of a video with testimonies from the project consortium members and members of the Advisory Committee, and was shot at the project's second plenary meeting, 27-29 April 2022 in Spain. The participants discuss what makes the REXUS project different and give concrete examples of tools being developed by the project which can help stakeholders address their local Nexus challenges.
